Black History - Celebrating Trailblazers

Grade Level: 1st-3rd

Duration: 45-60 minutes

Standards Alignment:

• Visual Arts: Understand and use artistic tools to create and communicate meaning.

- Social Studies: Identify important individuals and their contributions to history.
- Language Arts: Describe people, places, and events using descriptive language.

Learning Objectives

- Students will learn about significant Black historical figures.
- Students will create a portrait of a chosen figure using the ChalkWild backpack.
- Students will use one word to describe the figure's impact.

Success Criteria

- I can name a Black historical figure and explain their contributions.
- I can draw a simple portrait of my chosen person.
- I can write one word that describes their impact.

Lesson Components

1 Beginning (10-15 min) - Introduction & Discussion

- Show images of influential Black figures (Rosa Parks, MLK, Mae Jemison, Misty Copeland, etc.).
- Read a short biography or watch a 2-minute video about each.
- Ask: "What did this person do that was important?"

2 Middle (20-25 min) - Drawing on the ChalkWild Backpack

- Students choose a figure and draw their portrait on their backpack.
- Around the portrait, they write one descriptive word (e.g., Brave, Leader, Dreamer).

3 End (10-15 min) - Presentation & Reflection

- Students share their artwork with a partner or the class.
- Encourage discussion: "Why did you choose this person?"
- Clean backpacks and reflect on what they learned.

Supports for Diverse Learners

- ✔ Provide printed outlines to trace for students who need fine motor support.
- ✓ Allow verbal responses instead of writing for students who struggle with literacy.
- ✔ Offer sentence starters: "I chose ____ because..."
